# Secondary Education 1964: Junior High School, Aitutaki & Tereora College, Rarotonga.

- 1969 Sat NZ School Certificate (5 Subjects)
- Goal to attend University in NZ.
- Results passed Biology, Physics, Maths, Geography but fail English.
- So scholarship to Uni is out, choice of either repeat NZSC or go to Fiji for Nursing
- Nursing was never in my system BUT I did not want to go back to School.
- So Nursing in Fiji was the final decision, and this was the best decision I have made in my life with no regrets what so ever.

#### **Beginning of my Nursing Journey:**

- 1970 Fiji Nursing School was my life for the next three and half yrs. I enjoyed and loved nursing very much.
  - "So Vinaka Vakalevu Fiji."
- I enrolled in the NZ Program with a Cook Island Student Nurse who was already training in Rarotonga Hosp.
- 1973 moved to NZ strait after State Final Exams
- 1974 joined Auckland School of Nursing graduated as a NZRGON.
- In 1976 met my husband and returned to the Cook Islands.

# Lifetime Career as Public Servant: 47yrs.

- Nursing Clinical, Nursing Education, Public Health and Management.
- Worked as RN, RM Charge nurse/Manager, Nursing Tutor, Principal CISN and, Chief Nursing Officer.
- Countries Worked in Fiji, New Zealand, Australia and Cook Islands.
- President of the CI Nurses Assoc.
- 1997 ventured into a completely new direction as Director for Women Youth and Sports in the Min. of Internal affairs. This was a huge challenge but a rewarding experience.

# Contribution to Nursing/Health Developments:

- As CNO, was a member of the MOH Executives who are responsible for decision making relating to the efficient management and ensure that the Divisional and Ministry outputs are achieved.
- 1978 Worked with a WHO Nurse Consultants develop Nursing Curriculum and re-establish the Nursing School
- Two separate reviews of the Nursing Curriculum by WHO consultants - and was upgraded to Diploma Program.
- The Nurse Practitioner's Training Program was introduced to staff the Outer Islands with small populations. These nurses took over the role that was previously held by Doctors.

# Nursing developments cont.

- Partnership with MIT Auck, in granting 1 yr scholarship for C Is Trained Nurses to attend a 1 yr post graduate training to attain a Bachelor in Nursing Qualification.
- This opened the way for some of these nurses to undertake Masters training at AUT. These Nurses have assumed senior leadership roles in Nursing and the MOH.
- A member and Chair of the Nursing Council that began the deliberations regarding the Nurses Code of Ethics, practice and competencies.

#### **Nursing Developments cont.**

- Was founding member, chairperson and host of the first SPCNOA in 2004. (SPCNMOA)
- Former Member of Advisory Board, WHO Collaborating Center for Nursing, Midwifery and Health Developments, University of Technology, Sydney, 2008.

#### **Doctoral Studies:**

 2007, moved to NZ for PhD studies at the FMHSc at UOAuckland.

On completion I returned to the CIs. and was appointed as the Director of Public, a position I held until my retirement in October 2017.



#### Retirement:

- Although retired, I am still contributing in some ways to health development by supporting as a supervisor our Pacific Masters and PhD students at the UOA.
- Work with NGOs Red X. Women and Child health.
- Set up an Informal "CI Retired Nurses Association." The aim is to "Provide social and Psychological support for each other.
- Compile/writing a book to record the great work and contribution some of our retired nurses who have given so much to Nursing and the people of the Cook Is.
